We are parents. We care a great deal about the safety of our products and set out to choose only the safest materials to put into our Oh Plah! bracelets.

And if you're reading this, then we're guessing that you too care about the safety of the things that you give to your children. For our Oh Plah! bracelets, not only did we consult with an MIT-educated plastics engineer, but we also spent an entire year researching our options to be sure that we made the best choice. First and foremost, we wanted something safe. Second, we wanted something recyclable. And lastly, we wanted something that could make a really cool, functional bracelet that would retain its shape and show little to no signs of wear once our babies and kids bit it, twisted it, and squished it over and over again.

So after months of research, we decided on what we think is the perfect choice. All Oh Plah! bracelets are constructed of medical grade thermoplastic. This material is non-toxic and free of BPA, phthalates, latex, lead and other heavy metals. It has undergone rigorous testing to be sure that it is biocompatible and completely safe. We chose thermoplastic over silicone because it's recyclable, and it won't stretch out or lose its shape over time.

The beautiful colors are worth mentioning too. There is no surface coating on the bracelets, and the colorants are medical grade or FDA food quality, rigorously tested to guarantee that they are non-toxic.

Each style and color of the Oh Plah! bracelet went through an independent US material testing lab to ensure that it meets or exceeds the Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act (CPSIA) regulations.
